### Recommended Action:

#### Recommendation

It is recommended that City Council:

- Award a Professional Services Agreement to Civil Source in the amount of \$143,636 to prepare reports as required pursuant to the City-Wide Building & Facilities Condition Assessment Request for Proposal;
- Authorize the Director of Public Works to make changes as necessary within the approved budget;
- 3. Determine whether or not to approve an additional scope of work not to exceed \$80,000 to evaluate City facilities for school use as described; and
- Appropriate up to \$67,897 from the Capital Improvement Fund for the additional scope of work.

## **Body**

## Background:

In November 2014, staff released a Request for Proposals (RFP) to seven firms to perform comprehensive city building and facilities condition assessment services, and to create a final report for the following categories: Asbestos/Lead Testing, Space Planning and Use, Building ADA Compliance and Transition Plan, General Building Conditions (electrical, mechanical, plumbing, paint and architectural) and Public Right of Way ADA Analysis. Firms that received the RFP included PSOMAS, BOA Architecture, CH2M Hill, RBF, Kimley-Horn, Transystems and Civil Source. Only Civil Source and KAO/BOA responded to the RFP.

Proposals were received from the two (2) responding consultants, included pricing results as follows:

KOA/BOA

\$220,000

CivilSource:

\$143.636

Based upon these responses, staff is recommending the selection of Civil Source for their experience with similar projects and for the difference in their quoted fees.

Since receipt of the Civil Source proposal, and prior to a recommendation to award the contract, staff consulted with Civil Source on a possible revised scope of work. Specifically, staff asked Civil Source to also provide an evaluation of all appropriately sized City facilities for what would be required to bring said facilities up to code/legal requirements for potential school or student use. These facilities would include the following:

- City Hall,
- Kiwanis Buildings,
- Base 3 Building,
- Clark Building,
- Community Center.
- South Park Building
- 6th Street Storage Building.

The additional scope of work requested will not exceed \$80,000 if Council chooses to approve it.

### Fiscal Implications:

\$155,739 in funding is available in CIP 13-664 project account 001-8664-4201. \$67,897 is available in the Capital Improvement Fund; the balance of this fund is \$2.6 million.
