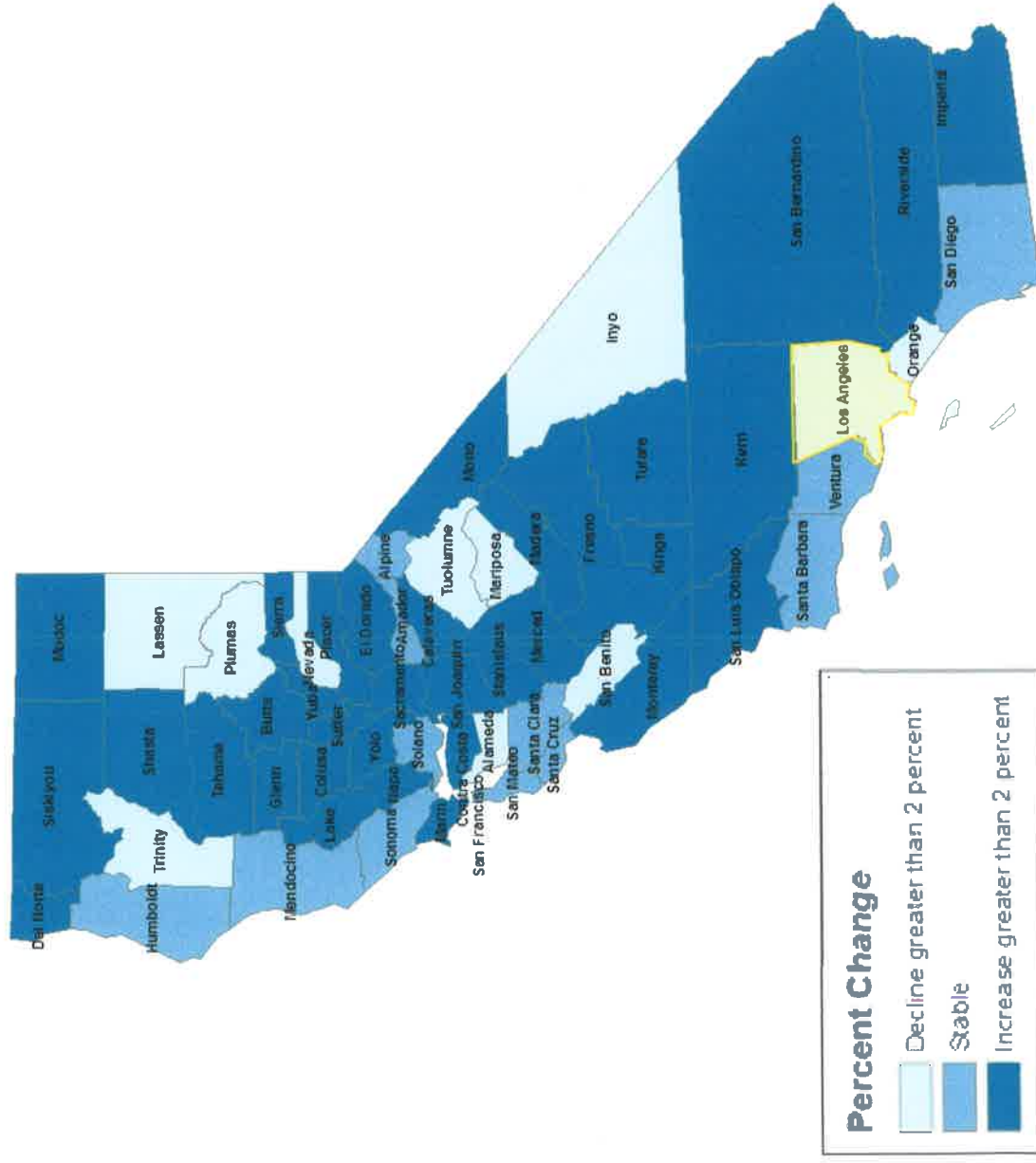

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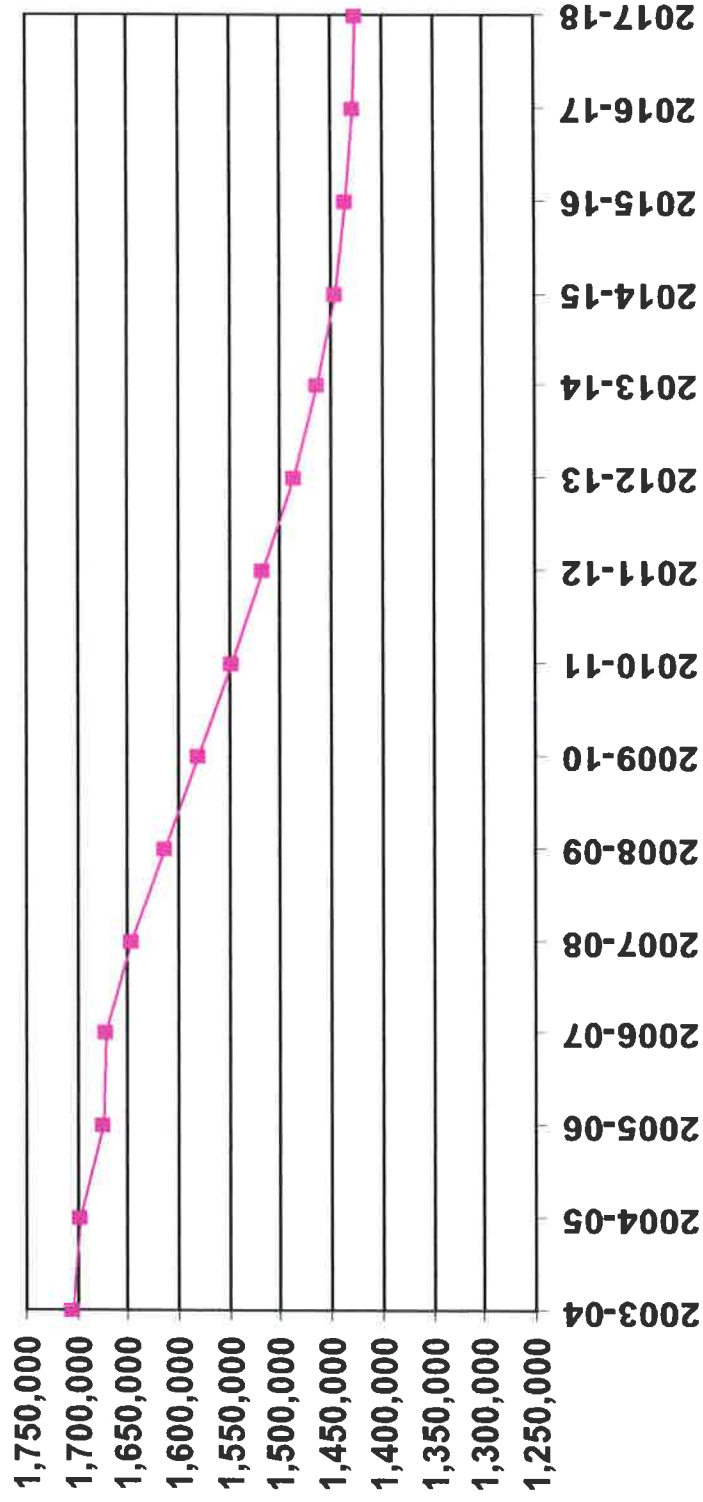
California Public K-12 Graded Enrollment Change, 2007-17

Los Angeles contains the largest number of students statewide, but overall enrollment in that county is projected to decline over the next year by 2.1% and by about 13% over the next ten years. Continuing declines in birth cohorts and the prolonged family out-migration to neighboring counties will reduce the K-12 enrollment in Los Angeles by 221,100 over this ten year period.

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DOF's forecast for LA County public K-12 graded enrollment indicates a steep decline.
